

On December 21st we marked the shortest day of the year. Many of us are thrilled that has passed! However, as my mother used to quote, "As the days grow longer, the cold grows stronger." We're certainly not done with cold weather yet! Three more months coming up!

Even though the days *are* getting longer, daylight is still in short supply and there are no holiday lights to brighten the nights. 

LEARNING MINISTRIES DAY Milestone Ministry – Vibrant Faith through Life Schedule Saturday, January 24, 2015 Hope Lutheran Church, Cherryville, PA 8:30 a.m. (registration) until 3:00 p.m.

Every January our synod sets up a learning ministries day. What is that? It's a Saturday chock full of opportunities to not only learn more about faith, but also ways to share it. It's open to anyone who wants to learn and is lots of fun. Folks come from congregations all over northeastern Pennsylvania to attend.

Curious? The keynote speaker, Debbie Streicher, will challenge us to think about "Vibrant Faith Through Life." Debbie Streicher has facilitated and developed faith formation programs for all ages in the congregational setting for the past 25 years. She is Coordinator of Milestone Ministry. As a volunteer, she serves as President for the Christian Education Network of the ELCA.

The keynote presentation will be followed by workshops and lunch. New Jerusalem will cover the registration fee for anyone who wants to attend. Those who would like to make a contribution to help cover the costs, should place it in the offering basket in an envelope marked: "Learning Ministries Day."

Please be sure to sign up on the bulletin board in the narthex or let Pastor Ruth know **by January 6**th whether you want to attend and your choice of workshops.

BRIEF WORKSHOP DESCRIPTIONS – see more detailed sheets in the narthex.

- A. **Nurturing Faith Every Day in the Home (afternoon only)** Look at a simple five-step faith practice that could change a child, a family, a world.
- B. What's with All the Drama? Learn about how a Christian theater group tries to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ alive through theater. Participants will learn a powerful use of confession and the Lord's Prayer.
- C. **Igniting the Spiritual Imagination of the Generations: The Saint John's Bible** Not a new word translation, but a new visual translation, The Saint John's Bible is a significant artistic masterpiece. Its mission is to ignite the spiritual imagination of people of all faiths around the world.
- D. "Yeah We've Got an App for That!" A brief review of faith-related applications (apps) for smartphones and tablets (as well as a few online programs for all computers). The presenter's hope is that each participant will come away with two apps that can help in some aspect of his/her faith journey.
- E. Vacation Bible School Preview (morning only) Samples of 2015 VBS curricula.
- F. Good News for Children Now: A Brief Introduction to Godly Play® Godly Play® offers a creative, child-honoring way of entering and experiencing the stories of the people of God in sacred stories, the parables of Jesus, and lessons about the Christian community in worship. Children are invited to make their own discoveries about themselves and God through visual, tactile, oral storytelling, verbal wondering, and non-verbal self -directed creative activities. In this workshop, adult participants are invited to explore the heart of Godly Play®,

- engage in a story with wondering, reflect on the experience and, maybe, discover new possibilities for ministry.
- G. **Strengthening the Home Church Connection (morning only) –** Come for loads of ideas from a variety of resources and hear what has worked in other congregations. See how social media can help strengthen the home-church connection.
- H. **Equipping Parents as Primary Religious Educators (afternoon only)** When does religious education begin? What is the difference between religious education and faith formation? Check out this workshop to get tools for helping you equip parents to be the primary religious educators for their children.
- I. **Nurturing Faith throughout the Year** Parents are their children's first teacher of the faith as they grow and change. Milestones throughout the year offer opportunities to teach your family about Jesus and how he is with us day-to-day. Learn about and try different projects for birthdays, holidays, vacations and the school year.
- J. Empowering Children and Youth in Faith Communities (morning only) What would it take for your faith community to become a place young people described as essential, exciting, inspiring, and empowering? How do we create relevant, meaningful, and engaging settings where children and youth thirst to be involved? Through discussion and review of existing resources for identifying Spiritual gifts, we will consider the steps needed to grow communities where children and youth are empowered to "do" ministry.
- K. Milestones: Taking One Step at a Time (afternoon only) In this workshop, participants will be invited to participate in a Q&A session about Milestones Ministry. Time will be spent discussing how existing ministries can be renewed ministries through the lens of milestones in our lives.
- L. **Conversations with God** Why should we pray? What does prayer look like? What does our Lutheran faith have to teach us about prayer? What are some prayer practices we can incorporate into our daily devotions?
- M. **Baptism Boxes** Workshop participants will learn how to make Baptism boxes to remember a Baptism day and the gifts of this Sacrament. Ideas will be shared about how and when these boxes can be presented. Participants are invited to bring with them: a box, decorating materials, and supplies, and Baptism mementos.
- N. **Instagram Testimonies (afternoon only)** What happens when you combine a smartphone, a group of youth equipped with questions about faith, and homebound members and other adults and children? Instagram testimonies as a way to connect generations in the church through their faith stories in a very profound way! Our social media savvy young people have gifts to share to help congregations tell their faith stories. Learn ways to help empower them to use their social media gifts in your congregation.
- O. **Music for All Ages** In so much of our lives, we are separated by age. God is calling all of us to be in community with each other, no matter our ages. Music is one way to bridge the gaps and to make community. But when we all gather as God's people of all ages, what songs can we sing together?
- P. **Inspirational Painting across the Generations (morning only)** Visual arts help us remember the biblical stories and draw us into a deeper relationship with God. The nonverbal medium of visual arts can be used by all ages to nurture faith. Participants will have the opportunity for a hands-on-experience using acrylic paints to interpret a Bible verse.

Ephesians 4:4-6 talks a lot about one Create one painting that says it all.




What you need:
