LIVING WATERS

This month as we celebrate Pentecost and enter the time after Pentecost, we think about the how what we know as the Christian Church was birthed and spread. We often associate the work of God's Spirit with the image of flame, recalling the story from Acts where the Spirit blows into Jerusalem and something that looked like tongues of fire rested on each of the disciples. Water, in some ways the opposite of fire, is also an image of God's Spirit.

Last month I wrote about the retreat at Bear Creek Camp our confirmands attended. On our last morning at Bear Creek we gathered at the lake and were encouraged to quietly observe our surroundings and to listen for what these might be saying to us. What I "heard" was how the creeks that fed the lake, the lake itself, and the area where it drained off were like our congregation and the greater church.

Just as the springs, the water from soggy beaver dam area and the streams come together to form the body of water, the lake, we come from many directions and experiences and we mingle together, forming a most interesting "body". This body, like the lake, is calm at times, turbulent at others, but always mixing, exploring and experiencing what it means to be together. Like drops we impact one another and change, are full of life and feed life within the larger body and on the shores. Eventually, we must move on, dividing as it were into springs and streams that flow out from the lake to mix and merge again to form different bodies of water, even the sea. We *must* move on or the "lake" will become stagnant and life within it will die. In our mixing and our moving, our beliefs are challenged and we are encouraged to continue to develop as we grow and experience different circumstances.

Each Sunday during the time after Easter we thank God for the gift of the water, and particularly the waters of Baptism. This year our thanksgiving takes on particular meaning on Pentecost as we celebrate the baptism of Lillian Sue Lambert and welcome her into the body of Christ.

We hope that you will join us on Pentecost. Even if you can't, please join us in praying,

We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by Your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. . . . By water and your word you claim us as daughters and sons, making us heirs of your promise and servants of all. . . . We praise you for the gift of water that sustains life, and above all we praise you for the gift of new life in Jesus Christ. Shower us with your Spirit, and renew our lives with your forgiveness, grace and love. Amen

CONFIRMATION CLASS UPDATE

Our confirmands are finishing up their study of the Old Testament and starting to work on the New. Recent lessons focused on stories of Esther and Daniel, stories meant to inspire faithful people to dare to stand up for God, especially in tough times. Beginning with May 1st we will focus on the time when Jesus lived, including the rise of the Roman Empire, as well as who Jesus is according to the gospel writers.

COUNCIL MEETING UPDATE

The following items were discussed at their April 11th meeting:

- Holding an indoor craft show/bake sale some time in the fall between September and October.
- Pastor is continuing to update the Constitution. The team working on revisions will meet shortly and plans are to have it presented to the congregation in the fall.
- Dawn Wengert completed the Parking Lot Fund poster. Each parking space on the poster will represent a dollar amount the congregation has paid towards the cost of repaying the parking lot. As of the end of March, \$4,171 has been contributed towards the parking lot repaying expense.
- An idea for the interactive display that represents New Jerusalem during God's Playground at the Synod Assembly was to have something geared toward Relay for Life. An idea about having supplies to make bracelets or keychains was discussed.
- The idea was introduced to purchase a digital projector that can show DVDs and link to a laptop and can be used in classes as in the church during worship. Further discussion will take place when more facts are available.
- Council discussed the East Berks Mission District workshop that was held at Hope Lutheran. Pastor handed out a packet of information that council members will review.
- The confirmation class students will be reading the book of Luke until the end of May. Council members were encouraged to do the same.

RUTH - A PENTECOST STORY?

The disciples were celebrating Pentecost, originally a Jewish festival, when the Holy

Spirit descended on them and birthed the church. Pentecost, which began as a harvest festival, had come to commemorate



the giving of the law. The book of Ruth became integral to festival worship.

Why Ruth? This short story doesn't mention the law, let alone God giving it to Moses. Yet in Ruth's devotion to her mother-in-law ("Where you go I will go... Your people will be my people..." [Ruth 1:16, NIV], she fulfills not just the letter but the spirit of the law: lovingkindness — all the more remarkable because she's a foreigner. Boaz, too, demonstrates exorbitant kindness to Ruth.

As Christians celebrate the Spirit bridging differences in Jerusalem, uniting all nationalities by making the gospel message intelligible to all people, we too can remember Ruth's story. For in it, God unites two enemy peoples for his grand purpose: Boaz and Ruth's marriage leads to King David and, ultimately, to King Jesus. Today, the Holy Spirit continues to unite all categories of people under Christ's reign for the good of the world.

Al-Anon meetings are "open" meetings, which still means a respect for anonymity, but anyone can attend.

The group meets Wednesdays at 8:00 a.m. and Saturdays at 9:00 a.m. If you know someone who might benefit from AA and/or Al-Anon, please let them know about the meetings. Let people know that help is available.

MISSION SUPPORT (BENEVOLENCE)

As we enter the season of Pentecost and remember how the early church found that the good news of Jesus Christ was too good to keep, consider how our national church, the ELCA, uses the funds it receives.

Of the \$1,623 our congregation contributed as benevolence to the synod in 2014, \$746 was forwarded to the national church.

In 2014 the ELCA used 27% of the funds it received from all its synods, (\$201 of our donation) to grow the ELCA in the United States by:

- a) planting and supporting 340 new congregations;
- enabling congregations to renew their ministries and reach out to surrounding communities;
- c) developing and sharing resources for faith, discipleship, prayer and worship; and
- d) working together with our African Descent, American Indian and Alaska Native, Arab and middle Eastern, Asian and Pacific Islander, and Latino/Latina members to develop networks and resources for ministry.

The ELCA used **18**% (\$134 of our contribution) to **grow the Lutheran church around the world** by:

- a) supporting the Lutheran World Federation's global communion of churches with more than 80 companion churches in other countries;
- b) accompanying new Lutheran churches; and
- c) sending 220 missionaries to more than 40 countries, including 70 Young Adults in Global Mission.



SHIELD OF THE TRINITY

This symbol consists of a triangle with a circle at each point, labeled in Latin with the three Persons of the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy

Spirit. These "persons" are three ways God manifests Gods' self, yet we have only one God. Therefore a single circle in the center is labeled God. Six lines show the



relationships formed, with inner lines marked "is" and outer lines marked "is not." The resulting sign declares the mystery that God is Father, God is Son and God is Spirit. The three "Persons" are not the same, yet the three "Persons" are one. The three "Persons" are in such a close relationship that we know them as one God. Even so, we are invited into this relationship, to enjoy the closeness and to work together to bring about God's will.




On Mother's Day, express your love for your mom or another special woman by giving her this gift from the heart.
